Forgiveness

As Christians we are commanded to forgive. In the Lord's Prayer Jesus taught us to pray, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" (Matthew 6:12). Jesus followed this by saying "For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their sins, your Father will not forgive you" (Matthew 6:14,15).

Forgiving is sometimes hard when another person has hurt us badly, or disappointed us deeply. But if God has commanded it, then he guarantees that we can do it. The problem is not that we cannot forgive, or that God will not help us forgive. The problem is that often we do not want to forgive. In not wanting to forgive we say that the other person does not deserve our forgiveness. But forgiveness does not mean forgetting or condoning what another person has done. What we forget is that forgiveness is not for the person we forgive. Forgiveness is for us. When we carry a grudge, seek revenge, or carry hate for another person, we are harming ourselves. We stay stuck in the past instead of moving on with life. Many studies have demonstrated that hate produces many physical problems, including high blood pressure, headaches, backaches, stomach ulcers, colitis and even heart attacks

The original Greek word that is translated "forgive" means to untie. By forgiving we are untying ourselves from the past, and we become free to move on with our lives. Finally, by forgiving we obey God's command and we become imitators of Christ, who could say about those who crucified him: "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34).

Tackling Teenage Rebellion

You've done your best as a parent....but your teenager's rebellion has you feeling that your I best wasn't good enough. If you've tried to come to terms with your child in every reasonable way, yet problems with the law, alcohol, drugs or abusive behavior in your home continue, consider these guidelines.

First, admit your own limits — emotional, physical and financial. No one is perfect, so stop blaming yourself or circumstances for the problem. Realize that at this stage, "more compassion" or "better communication" alone is not the solution.

Be clear about your rights as a parent. Parents and children are not "equal" in many ways you are responsible to be in charge of your home. And keep responsibility for your child's behavior where it belongs - with the child. Don't play the "blame game" of excusing them by condemning teachers, police, peers, or anyone else. And don't bail them out from experiencing the legitimate consequences of their misbehavior.

Recognize the ways in which your child manipulated you: borrowing money with no intention of repayment; taking the role of "victim" — pushing you into the role of "persecutor"; threatening to damage your reputation, etc. Refuse to be manipulated in these and other ways.

Take a stand by drawing firm boundaries on acceptable behavior — and stick to them. If your clear rules are still ignored, withdraw from the child those family resources that make it possible for him or her to exploit you, such as the car — or even your home. If children are old enough, your insistence that they leave home and become totally responsible for themselves is often the healthiest step you can take, and the fairest to the rest of your family.

Talk to other parents with similar struggles for mutual support and objective insights. This is very important!

Have patience, courage and hope. Time is on your side.

A BLESSING IN DISGUISE?

Nearly all the media coverage of the recent Los Angeles earthquake managed somehow to overlook the fact that the heart of the nation's pornography industry "happened" to coincide with the epicenter of the quake.

Newsman William Arnold of the New York Times News Service noted that the area comprised of the communities of Chatsworth, Northridge and Canoga Park is home to approximately 70 companies, which together produce more than 95 percent of the nation's output of porn videos.

The largest of these, VCA Pictures of Chatsworth, which normally produces more than 100 obscene videos each year, was so damaged by the quake that no one had been back inside the office building since the morning of the quake, Arnold wrote. "It's all over for them," said the manager of another video firm. "Their whole operation is gone—all their equipment and masters."


MARK THESE DATES

From the Library



A Smelly Ambition

"What is your ambition in life today? Is it to get rich? Is it to make a name for yourself? Is it even to do some wonderful thing for God? Listen to me, beloved. The highest desire that can possess any human heart is a longing to see God."

—J. Vernon McGee

How can we be so far off track? Ask most anyone who calls himself/herself a Christian, and what you will probably hear is talk of ambitions that center on career, position, money, or things. Vernon McGee says No, that's off base; the Christian's greatest ambition must be a longing to see God.

Second to that, however, is the one Paul describes in I Timothy 3:1, the longing to be an overseer in God's church. Great ambition: become powerful, tell people what to do, decide what the church can and can't do, decree how things will run, hand down rulings on controversial issues, judge ecclesiastical disputes between church members. An exciting life!

Except for one thing: that's not what the Bible means by "overseer." Acts 20:28 defines the word: the overseer is the one who carries out his work by being a shepherd of the flock of God. Picture the work of a first-century



shepherd, and the words that come to mind are not "judge, decide, decree, hand down rulings." What comes to mind is a smell: the smell of sheep. Shepherds are those who stay so close to their sheep that they come to smell like them. They are bloody with the sheep's wounds. Their eyes are blurred from staying up at night with troubled sheep. Their arms are tired from holding scared sheep in their reassuring arms. Their feet are sore from wandering over the hills looking for missing sheep.

If that lifestyle is what one wants, Paul told Timothy, the choice is a good one. It's the lifestyle of Jesus, the Shepherd of our souls.



When Thomas Carlyle had finished writing his history of the French Revolution, he took the manuscript to a neighbor, John Stuart Mill, for proofreading. A few days later, Mill came to Carlyle's house with disastrous news. His maid had used the manuscript to start a fire in the fireplace.

Carlyle raged like a madman for several days. For two full years he had poured his whole being into that manuscript. Now, it was gone. Two years of his life were reduced to ashes. In view of that tragic blunder, Carlyle thought he could never again give himself to the difficult discipline of writing.

One day Carlyle stood looking out his second story window over the rooftops near his home. Across the way he saw a stone mason slowly and patiently rebuilding a collapsed wall, putting one stone upon another, until finally the new wall took form. For the first time Carlyle accepted the unfortunate mistake of his past and began to rewrite his book. Diligently, one page at a time, one day at a time, he wrote and finished what was probably his finest work.

To make things right when they go wrong in your life, you must rebuild by carefully replacing one stone of your life upon another, one day at a time.

As they rode home the father grumbled about the long sermon; the teenage daughter complained about the dull announcements; the mother griped about the song leader selecting songs she didn't know. The seven-year-old said, "I thought it was pretty good, considering we all got in for a dollar."

When a person stumbles out of the church building fuming about the shoddy service, he had better examine himself! The service probably had its weak spots...but surely the whole thing wasn't bad. Leaving worship without being blessed is like going into a huge department store where hundreds of thousands of dollars of merchandise is displayed, and coming out with a \$.49 item. You come out with what you went in to get.

When you go to worship expecting to receive a blessing you're likely to receive it. When you go to worship to be a blessing to others, you're likely to achieve it. But you're bound to leave empty if you entered with a critical attitude. You expect the song leader to miss the pitch. You expect a shallow sermon. Neither of those guys is on your "favorite people list" anyway. You decided before they ever started, if you'll be truthful about it, that you weren't

going to like "the performance". And that's part of the problem...you view it as a performance. You came as a spectator rather than a participant!

You're to be pitied if you receive nothing. You keep going because you're duty bound, but you go as a critic, not as a worshipper or an encourager. In that frame of mind there's no way you can praise God or build up others.

The spirit that wins in worship is the one that goes saying, "I was glad when they said to me, Let us go to the house of the Lord" (Psalm 122:2). If you want to be spiritually fed you've got to bring the appetite!

Did you go away full or empty? It's not the church, friends, it's you!

A Literal Hell?

We don't like to talk about hell, do we? "A loving God wouldn't send people to hell." So we dismiss it. But to dismiss it is to dismiss a core teaching of Jesus. And to dismiss it is to dismiss the presence of a loving God and the privilege of a free choice. Let me explain.

We are free either to love God or not. He invites us to love him. He urges us to love him. He came that we might love him. But, in the end, the choice is yours and mine. To take that choice from each of us, for him to force us to love him, would be less than love.

Hell was not prepared for people. Hell "was prepared for the devil and his angels." For a person to go to hell, then is for a person to go against God's intended destiny. "God has not destined us to the terrors of judgment, but to the full attainment of salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ." Hell is man's choice, not God's choice.

Hell is the chosen place of the person who loves self more than God, who loves sin more than his Savior, who loves this world more than God's world. Judgment is that moment when God looks at the rebellious and says, "Your choice will be honored."

To reject the dualistic outcome of history and say there is no hell leaves gaping holes in any banner of a just God. To say there is no hell is to say God condones the rebellious, unrepentant hearts. To say there is no hell is to portray God with eyes blind to the hunger and evil in the world. To say there is no hell is to say that God doesn't care that people are beaten and massacred, that he doesn't care that women are raped or families wrecked. To say there is no hell is to say God has no justice, no sense of right and wrong, and eventually say God has no love. For true love hates what is evil.

Our task on earth is singular — to choose our eternal home. You can afford many wrong choices in life. You can choose the wrong career and survive, the wrong city, the wrong house, the wrong mate. But there is one choice that must be made correctly and that is your eternal destiny.



Loosely translated, Jesus' message was, "Your situation will not be easier if you go into a corner and allow it to overwhelm you. Get up and let God use you for Him."



It has been a great blessing to witness the dramatic way that God is using the church in Southern California and how Christians across the nation have risen quickly to help and heal their brothers and

sisters. Your gifts have provided food for the hungry, water for the thirsty, clothes and blankets for the cold, and shelter for those whose homes were destroyed. God bless you and keep you."

A Successful Eighth Year In India's Harvest Field

The success of our work in India in 1993 and into this year can be measured in many ways, but one of the most important to me, other than the number of souls we were able to reach for Christ, was being able to labor for six straight months without having to return to the United States to raise more money! All I can offer is a heartfelt "THANK YOU!" to those of you who were just as determined to keep Pam and me there as we were determined to stay. When we developed projections for our work early in 1993 we began planning on a budget that would keep us in India for at least four months. We calculated the budget needed based on past campaign experience, but we continued to pray that additional funds would become available to keep us in India for six months. With the indispensable help that you provided we were able to stretch our resources, keep the work running at nearly full speed, and accomplish nearly everything that we set out to do in 1993! Unfortunately, though, we were forced to postpone some important printing of training literature, cut back on purchases of Bibles, New Testaments and song books, delay construction of one building for the church, and reduce our campaigning to twenty-three districts out of the original twenty-nine planned. Nonetheless, I am extremely pleased with what was accomplished during six months of joint labor with our Indian brothers and sisters.





President Johnson received a letter from a professor who teaches philosophy at a major public institution in Michigan. He wrote:



"BE NOT CONFORMED TO THIS WORLD..." - Romans 12:2

Christians are commanded to be different from those around them who are not Christians. Of course, this does not mean that our mode of behavior is different in every respect. We do not enter our houses via the window because those in the world go in the front door. The differences between Christians and non-Christians are more substantial.

Christians have been called out of the world to become an holy nation. (I Pet. 2:9). Holiness is demonstrated by conversation, by conduct toward others, and by appearance. In all these areas Christians are to be visibly different from the owrld.

I am sorry to observe that the uniqueness of Christians is not always manifest. With the advent of warmer weather and changes in fashion has come a temptation to conform to worldly standards. This is a serious problem for both Christian men and women. Whether by design or carelessness. too many Christian women have allowed the sensous apparel of this world to become a part of their wardrobes and, consequently, have presented Christian men with the burden of struggling with impure desires. This should never be! This is particularly upsetting when such immodest dress is seen in the assembly. Tube tops, halter tops, dresses slit up the side, tight, form-fitting clothing, and even an occasional bare midriff - all these present a serious problem to men who are trying to control their thoughts and bring them into conformity with the standards of purity demanded of God's people. The task is difficult enough as we move about in

CONCERNING OUR DRESS IN WORSHIP W. Terry Varner

For some time, I and others (not just preachers) have expressed concern among ourselves over the very casual dress in the worship services by both men and women, both young and old. This is evident in the participants (all who are present), both in the pew

and those who lead the congregation in worship of God.

Casual dress is often excused by reasoning that the outward appearance is not important and that it does not matter what one wears in worship as long as the heart is right. However, it is apparent that it matters very much to those who say it does not matter at all. Why? Because those who defend such assertions are plainly saying something by what they are wearing and not wearing to worship God. It is often stated, and wrongly so, that there is nothing solemn and special about our worship assemblies; i.e., they are very informal and casual. Public worship of God is neither informal nor casual. True, the Bible does not prescribe the uniform for wearing to worship God, but there are some definite Biblical principles set forth. Consider with me, from God's Word, the following.

The Bible teaches that clothing reveals many things. It clearly states that we have no Biblical right to discriminate against the poor man, nor to favor the rich man (James 2:2-4). The problem of concern is not with those who cannot afford better than what they wear to worship, for all have better. The problem of concern is the attitude of the worshiper. We are told, "Jehovah seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but Jehovah looketh on the heart" (I Sam. 16:7). Someone quickly states: "See, what we wear in worship is not important." A re you sure? In Exodus 28 and 29, God required distinctive garments for those leading in worship. Worship in heaven is described with beautiful garments (Rev. 4:4; 7:9, 13-14). Christians are exhorted to walk (this includes our dress both in and out of worship) "blameless and harmless, children of God without blemish" (Phil. 2:14) and to dress modestly to profess godliness (I Tim. 2:9-10). From these Scriptures, and from others (Prov. 7:10; 31:22-25; Matt. 22:11-13; Titus 2:5), we can argue that our clothing tells what we think of ourselves and God.

Worship is an act of reverence paid to our Creator, God (Matt. 4:10, John 4:24). Worship involves acts. Worship is an act of reverence paid to God; i.e., it involves our attitude which must find acceptance in the will of God. The acts or worship and our at-

titude in worship cannot be separated.

I am concerned when brethren, male or female and regardless of age, wear recreational, work and lounging clothes to worship services; i.e., blue-jeans, tee-shirts, shorts, etc. I am concerned when it is expressed that what one wears to worship does not matter. We ought to wear our best to worship God.

A RECURRING PROBLEM

As we approach the summer months, the matter of "Christian Dress" is again appropriate. In this bulletin there are two articles that have been written on this subject, from two different perspectives. The elders uroe that every member please read them and seriously consider the issues that are made and based upon these scriptural teachings to be conscious of his/her dress and especially when you come to the assembly to worship God. May our attire be modest, respectful, considerate and without offense to either members or visitors as we seek to worship God in reverence and love.

THERE IS NO RIGHT WAY TO DO A WRONG THING

OUR MINISTER

Our minister is a messenger of God to teach us the better way of life. As a faithful servant, let us respect him in honor as we listen to his message. When we honor him we honor God; when we dishonor him, we dishonor God (Mt. 10:40-42).

Our minister is a fellow-citizen in the kingdom. This means that he, like ourselves, should regulate his conduct by the laws of the King. All members of the kingdom should subscribe to the same holy standard. We should expect no more or no less of our minister than we expect of ourselves. Our King is not the author of a double standard.

Our minister is a laborer in the vineyard and therefore worthy of his hire (Mt. 10:10, Lk. 10:7). He is a gospel preacher, and therefore should live of the gospel (I Cor. 9:14). His support should be adequate.

Our minister is a neighbor. Therefore, we should love him as we love ourselves (Mt. 7:12, 22:39). Loving him thus, we will do him no injury, we will bless him.

Our minister is a public man. He is forever "on the spot." He stands on the line of battle. He fights sin. In fighting sin, he may incur the anger of the sinner. The sinner may seek to do him injury. From all unjust attacks, we must shield our minister.

The duty of our minister is to study, to teach, and to preach. To the end that he may be effective in his assigned task, let us not load him down with minor matters. It is his duty to visit unfortunate people, not because he is a minister or gospel preacher, but because he is a Christian.

May God richly bless him and his family with many more fruitful years in preaching the gospel.

CHRISTIAN RESPONSE NEEDED

There is a bill being considered in both houses of Congress that threatens the very work that the Lord commanded us to do, Mt 28:19-20. One very effective way, in our day and age, to "go into all the world and preach the gospel of Christ" is via radio and television. This bill called the "Fairness in Broadcasting Act" is an attempt to purge radio and TV of godly influence.

The "Fairness in Broadcasting Act" requires broadcasting stations to air opposing views on any subject that falls inot the category of "controversial issues of public importance." The church, by its very nature deals with subjects that fall into this category. Any person or special interest group that disagrees with our beliefs on God, salvation, marriage, sexuality, family, homosexuality, abortion, pornography etc. can petition every station that shows a program produced by the Lords church and air opposed points of view. In effect the government would force stations to comply with the "fairness rule" or be liable to a fine or legal action.

If this law is passed, we'll likely see one of two results, both of shich would be desastrous to our efforts to proclaim Gods Word.

Result #1 - No station wants to be tied up in regulatory or legal battles with special interest groups. Stations may very well decide to refuse any program that mentions any "controversial issue of public importance". In effect, we would be "shut down" in our evangelistic work over the airways.

Result #2 - Preaching, for instance, the Lords view on homosexuality, would open up a response pushing the homosexual agenda. Homosexual activists will demand the opportunity to promote their "rights" to marry, engage in immoral acts, and adopt children, all of which is contrary to God's will. By broadcasting one of our programs we would be placed in the bizarre position of actually promoting opportunities to those opposed to the Christian viewpoint. Neither of these results would be favorable to the Christian agenda.

This is why members of the Lord's church must work to stop this legislation now....before it becomes law.

The Highland Ave. church of Christ in Abilene Texas (that has sponsored the Herald of Truth ministry for 40 years) has sent the above information to thousands of churches of Christ throughout the brotherhood requesting help in stopping this legislation now. They ask that every member who is concerned about this issue to sign a petition, which with the thousands of others, will be personally delivered to the chairmen of the congressional committees considering this bill, by brother Randy Becton, one of the elders of the Highland church.

All of this was gone over last Wednesday evening in the assembly and many have expressed their concern and signed the petition already. Before you leave today would you please look at the booklet (which includes the petition sheets) which will be placed on the table in the south lobby. If you have any questions or desire to know more about this, please see one of the elders.

Let a Child Decide?

Q: Should a child be allowed to "decide for himself" on matters related to God? Aren't we forcing our religion down our children's throats when we tell them what to believe?

A: Let me answer with an illustration from nature. Shortly after it hatches from its shell, a gosling (baby goose) becomes attached, or "imprinted," to the first thing it sees moving nearby. From that time forward, the gosling follows that particular object. Ordinarily, it becomes imprinted to the mother goose that hatched the new generation. If she is removed, however, the gosling settles for any mobile substitute, whether alive or not. Time is the critical factor: the gosling is vulnerable to imprinting for only a few seconds after hatching. If that opportunity is lost, it cannot be regained.

There is also a critical period when certain kinds of instruction are easier in the life of children. There is a brief period during childhood when youngsters are vulnerable to religious training. Their concepts of right and wrong are formulated during this time, and their view of God begins to solidify.

As in the case of the gosling, the opportunity of that period must be seized when it is available. Leaders of the Catholic Church have been widely quoted as saying, "Give us the child until he is 7 years old, and we'll have him for life." They are usually correct because permanent attitudes can be instilled during these seven vulnerable years.

Unfortunately, however, the opposite is also true. The absence or misapplication of instruction through that primetime period may place a severe limitation on the depth of the child's later devotion to God. When parents withhold indoctrination from their small children, allowing them to "decide for themselves," the adults are almost guaranteeing that their youngsters will "decide" in the negative.

If parents want their children to have a meaningful faith, they must give up any misguided attempts at objectivity. Children watch closely to discover just how much their parents believe what they preach. Any decision or ethical confusion from the parent is likely to be magnified in the child.

After the middle adolescent age (ending about 15 years), children resent being told exactly what to believe. They don't want religion "forced down their throat," and they should be given more autonomy in what they believe. If the early exposure has been properly conducted, children will have an inner mainstay to steady them. Their early indoctrination, then, is the key to the spiritual attitudes they carry into adulthood.

SOME PLAIN FACTS

This permissive age has produced a generation which neither knows nor cares about Bible principles of morality. Chastity, the sanctity of marriage, and purity of heart almost seem to be relics of another age. Our young people are growing up under constant suggestions from the media and many of their friends that in moral matters "each can do his own thing." Many people of more mature years are also affected. Here are some plain facts for young and old. Fornication is sin. This means every kind of illicit sexual activity. The Bible is plain: Those who practice fornication cannot go to heaven (Gal. 5:19-21).

Homosexual activities are contrary to nature and God (Rom. 1:27). What is called "gay" will result in the damnation of Hell.

Pornography is a medium for lust and lasciviousness. This applies to suggestiveness, lewdness, nudity, etc., whether in printing, movies, or television. Jesus said, "Gut I say unto you, that whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart"(Mat. 5:28)

Things done in secret are never hidden. Actions too shameful to describe are sometimes done in secret (Eph. 5:12). Modern situations which provide privacy cause many to feel their sins are secret. God sees it all (Pro. 15:3). Every secret thing will be brought into judgment (Ecc. 12:14).

Love is not an excuse for sin. A typical defense for illicit sex is, "We love each other." At best this is self-deception. Love involves honor. In the highest sense of love, one will not cause the one he/she loves to do that which will put him/her in danger of the fires of Hell. One should be honest enough to call things by their right names. It's not love, it's lust (Rom. 13:14)!

Married love is God's plan for sexual fulfillment (Heb. 13:4). The duties and privileges of the marriage relationship are clear (1 Cor. 7:3-5). Husbands and wives are required by law (God's law) to love each other (Eph. 5:25, 28; Col. 3:18-19). Couples who "fall out of love" are not following God's plan.

Marriage is for life. No teaching of Christ is more plain than this (Mat.19:3-9). Regardless of what counselors, lawyers, or judges might say, one who causes the breakup of marriage for any cause except fornication sins against God. If he/she marries another (except when the mate put away was guilty of fornication) it is adultery.

There are situations (caused by sinful attitudes, selfishness, hatefulness, etc.) when a couple cannot stay together, but they are still married to each other. Even if under civil law they are divorced they are not free to marry others. The same restrictions of fidelity apply as if they were still together. They have no more right to "court" or to contemplate another marriage than they would if they were happily living together (See 1 Cor. 7:10-11).

There is never a marriage breakup without sin being involved. Both may not be guilty, but sin is an essential ingredient in divorce. It is tragic how casually some men and women hurt their mates, ruin their homes, and break the hearts of their children. It is more tragic when we consider the awful and eternal consequences of such callous disregard of the will of God (Heb.10:30-31).

Marriages which are guided by the principles of Christ are happy marriages. Because human beings are involved there aare often some stresses and strains. But principles as in Ephesians 4:32 and 5:22-23, 1 Peter 3:1-8, Acts 20:35, and Matthew 6:33 and 7:12 will show the way to overcome problems and to build happiness.





Murder is Wrong Under Any Circumstance George Keelin, Sr.

Last week, a doctor was shot to death outside an abortion clinic by a religious protester. This is wrong. No one has the right to take the law into their own hands, especially those professing to be Christians. Such actions soon result in anarchy and more violence. "Never take your own revenge, beloved, but leave room for the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." Romans 12:19.

Murder in the name of Christianity is particularly regrettable. Many folks already think 'church people' are gullible hypocrites who justify their own ungodliness by the Bible but feel free to pass judgment on all unbelievers for theirs. This is not true of genuine Christians.

One local "family planning provider physician" (double-speak for a doctor who performs abortions) announced he will henceforth wear a bullet-proof vest to work to protect himself from killers. And, regarding the man charged in the shooting, he declared passionately: "He murdered one of my peers in cold blood, remorselessly."

Pro-choice advocates are demanding that Congress pass a law to "protect the life of abortionists." Following the killing, a spokeswoman for Planned Parenthood said: "The rights of American women must not be restricted by vigilantes."

Before pro-choice advocates and Planned Parenthood hurl too many insults and angrily blame all Christians, they should apply their own logic:

They believe murder is wrong and should be punished--so do Christians!

They believe our freedom should not be restricted by vigilantes--so do Christians!

They believe no one has the right to murder another in cold blood, remorselessly--so do Christians!

They believe legislation should be passed to protect 'innocent' people from killers--so do Christians!

But what about the 1,500,000 babies remorselessly murdered every year by "Family Planning Providers?" Too bad they don't make bullet-proof vests for the unborn! Why not petition Congress to protect them?

The risks to abortion doctors is infinitesimal compared to that faced by people who visit their clinics--only half of them come out alive!


Somebody forgot the old adage, "You should practice what you preach!" Murder is wrong under any circumstances. Godly indignation is not.


PERSONAL WORK CLASS
