One of the best ways to figure out what God wants you to do with your life is to take a look at your abilities and assets. Finish this sentence by finding three or four things from this list:

"I am good at ..."

working with children listening and caring helping behind the scenes solving problems identifying problems coaching counseling organizing singing initiating spiritual discussions with unbelievers talking with sick sports sticking it out being sensitive to others thinking of sermons for someone else to give recognizing a physical need of my neighbors reading painting repairing cars providing transportation remembering details raking leaves typing making clothes being a godly parent spreading the word to everyone

motivating getting others involved peacemaking, reconciling cooking homemaking teaching adults teaching teenagers / See Joe O. teaching elderly teaching preschoolers teaching junior high teaching elementary school ages / runing a business making people laugh hanging out with kids raising money being an encouragement partner to a Christian studying with an unbeliever writing encouraging notes to a strugling brother or sister in Christ public prayer fixing mechanical things creating classroom decorations giving wise advise smiling being a teacher's aide drawing organizing my time talking up coming events giving a pat on the back

Let one of your friends help you identify two more areas from this list or from their own knowledge of you which he (or she) considers you "good at".

Now imagine how these abilities, your "good at" activities, can be used to share God's love and do His work in your circumstances. Then try what you imagined. Talents not used wisely (stewarded) will be lost, Mt. 25:28.
